This past year, Padrino Children's Foundation continued to grow in both reach and impact. We served 643 children and families, strengthened clinical excellence, and expanded our capacity to provide care for those who need it most.

More children benefited from integrated, multi-disciplinary care, now with greater family involvement to ensure long-term positive outcomes. And we had the joy of watching many patients who first came to us as infants or toddlers grow into thriving young people. Some are even graduating from our care. Their resilience continues to inspire all of us.

Leadership Transitions & Team Growth

We welcomed two accomplished new Board members, Chip Besse and Colleen Suche, who bring valuable expertise and fresh perspective to our mission.

We also celebrated a key leadership transition: After seven years of transformative service as Executive Director, founding member Dr. Alejandra Peña has joined our Board of Directors. Dr. Ale's vision and dedication helped shape Padrino into a professional, compassionate force for good in our community. Taking the helm as Executive Director is Dr. Mitzy Cervantes, a pediatrician and an inspiring leader committed to our mission. Dr. Mitzy is advancing our work to provide high-quality care to every child, regardless of financial circumstances, while continuing to explore new ways to enhance care and improve lives.

To meet rising demand, we expanded our clinical team by adding a second pediatrician, Dr. Eduardo Esquivel, along with new specialists in mental health, physical therapy, and support services. We also invested in team development and continuous process improvement to ensure the highest standards of care.

A Community That Cares

Our community of donors and supporters remains at the heart of Padrino. The creativity, generosity, and unwavering commitment that you, our donors, bring continue to inspire us. Together, we are changing and saving lives.

But we also face a new challenge. With rapid population growth and increasingly complex cases, the need for our services is outpacing our current capacity. We must grow to meet this need.

Thanks to a generous land donation followed by a lengthy planning and design process, we're nearing the construction start date for a new, purpose-built Pediatric Medical Center—a space designed to expand access and deliver more comprehensive care. We have already secured more than \$1,000,000 USD in donations and are seeking additional support to cover construction, equipment, and to ensure the long-term sustainability of this critical resource for our community.

Now is the time to invest in the future of our community.

There is no greater investment you can make in the future of our community.

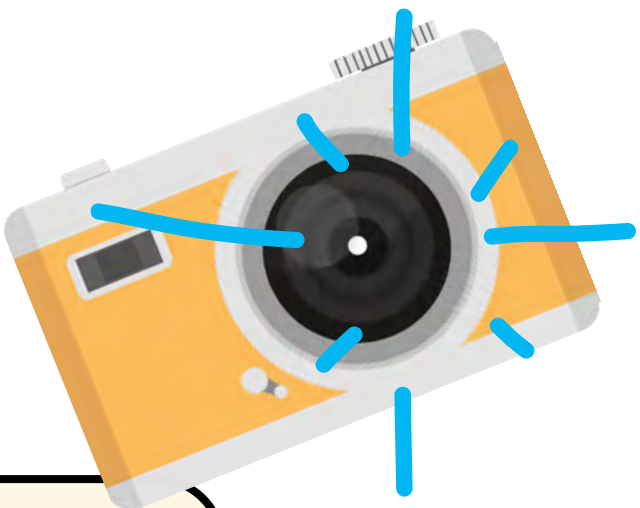

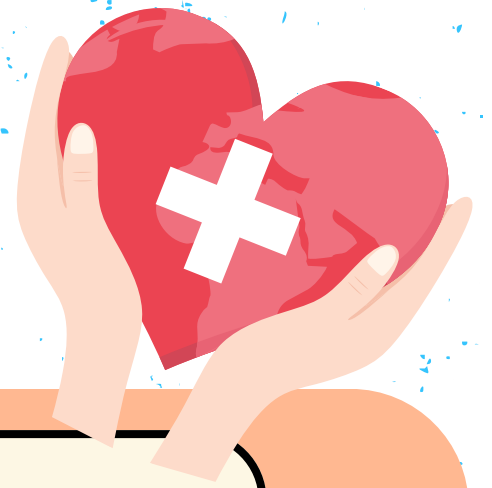

OUR IMPACT



When Padrino was founded in 2016, most local families had little or no access to pediatric healthcare. Changing that reality became our core mission.

Over the past nine years, we have built a dedicated team and now deliver a wide range of medical, psychological, and social health services, proudly treating an average of **136 children per month** across a rapidly growing population.

By the end of 2024, we had delivered **31,968 services to 1,736 local children** whose families could not otherwise afford care. Thanks to the generosity of our donors and support from U.S. and Mexican charitable organizations, we are seeing steady improvement in the long-term health and well-being of these children and communities.

OUR IMPACT ZONE



Padrino now serves nearly **20% of the local pediatric population** in Todos Santos, El Pescadero, and surrounding communities, whose families qualify based on financial hardship and their limited access to pediatric healthcare. Through our partnership with the **iHope Genetic Alliance Program**, our reach extends across all of Baja California Sur, helping more children receive the specialized care they need.

A NETWORK OF TRUSTED PARTNERS

To deliver comprehensive care to our patients, our clinical staff collaborates closely with a growing network of medical specialists across Mexico. Whenever possible, we minimize the need for families to travel to receive care; but when external referrals are needed, we ensure every patient is connected to high-quality partners.

In 2024, we expanded our network of medical partners to include new areas of pediatric specialization, such as Endocrinology (for visits within the Padrino clinic), Immunology (with focus on immunodeficiencies), Urology, and Pulmonology. We also strengthened ties with diagnostic services, hospitals, pharmacies, and other allied organizations, such as the Los Cabos Children's Foundation.

FINANCIAL AID FOR MEDICAL SERVICES (FAMS)

As soon as we learn of new medical specialists who have moved to the area, we invite them to join us in our commitment to the health and well-being of the little ones.



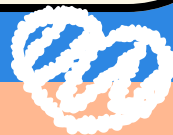

FAMS was our highest volume program, delivering 2,642 new interventions in 2024. It covers all pediatric medical care, medications, and specialist visits.

This year, we welcomed Dr. Eduardo Esquivel, a new Pediatrician who now leads and strengthens our program alongside our dedicated clinical team.



We also introduced an in-clinic Pediatric Endocrinology service in partnership with Dr. Adareli León, now providing routine care for ten of our patients. While telemedicine remains a valuable resource, these in-person services offer unmatched quality, reflecting our ongoing commitment to delivering the best possible care.



MENTAL & SOCIAL HEALTH (MSH)

A major achievement in 2024 was the addition of another psychologist, Lic. Jacqueline Olachea, which doubled our capacity for individual psychological care and increased the number of group therapeutic workshops.

Our MSH program was our second highest volume service delivering 1,144 therapeutic interventions in 2024. It continues to evolve with a noteworthy increase in multidisciplinary therapy plans, where treatments extend across specializations and integrate family and school environments.

Another important advancement in our MSH program is an intervention protocol developed by our social work and counseling team to detect parental anxiety and depression, factors that can influence a child's care. This approach supports timely referrals, improved family dynamics, and stronger clinical outcomes for the children we serve.



2024 PROGRAM PERFORMANCE



CHILDREN WITH SPECIAL NEEDS (CSN)

Many of our patients with developmental language delays found their voice with transformational results, fostering a new era of independence for each of them.

Our CSN program, serving children with neurodevelopmental, physical, and vocational therapy needs, delivered 379 interventions in 2024.

Of great significance was the improvement of patient language development through time-appropriate stimulation and the use of pictograms to learn how children express themselves and strengthen family communication. Padrino often works directly with the families as part of the treatment plan, equipping caregivers with tools to support their child's progress. These efforts help each child reach their goals with greater confidence and independence.

RARE GENETIC DISEASES

We conducted our largest clinic to date in October 2024, with 61 evaluations performed, the delivery of specialized genetic counseling, and 51 family candidates referred for advanced study.

In partnership with the iHope Genetic Alliance program, Padrino has conducted nine rare genetic disease clinics, including two in 2024 that resulted in 368 interventions for the year. Diagnosis rates continue to exceed 60%, providing families with definitive answers and physicians with clinical direction for treatment that can be life changing for the children in need.

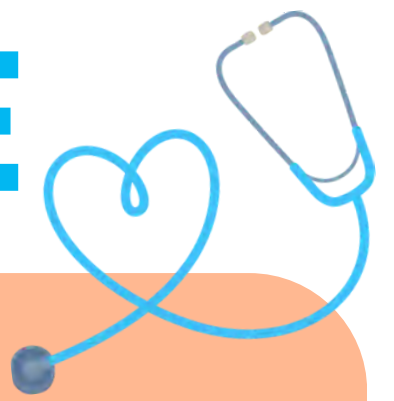
We expanded our network to include well-established and highly respected institutions like the Hospital Infantil de México and Mendelics Laboratory in Brazil. These partnerships were essential to this year's success.



We're especially proud to have co-authored a ground-breaking research study with iHope, published in the American Journal of Human Genetics (Thorpe E, 2024), exploring the clinical value of genetic sequencing (cGS) in rare disease diagnosis and treatment.

We are grateful to the Genetic Alliance for its invaluable support and making this work possible, and for helping us to bring diagnostic equity and hope to so many families across Baja California Sur.

HEALTH CLINICS

We hosted the U.S. non-profit Sight is a Right with great success! Over four days, 36 eyecare professionals served more than 2,300 residents and ordered 650 prescription eyeglasses.

In 2024, we introduced a series of community-wide health clinics that received an overwhelmingly positive response, resulting in 303 pediatric interventions. These medical evaluation clinics and educational outreach workshops are often conducted in local schools or migrant camps, to reach children who might otherwise go unseen.



Our ability to conduct these clinics is only possible because of the dedication and professionalism of our team and the incredible support and generosity of our community, who show up with their time, resources, and heart.

ITZAYANA – EIGHT YEARS OF PARTNERSHIP

Itzayana first came to Padrino in 2017 with a diagnosis of Spastic Infantile Cerebral Palsy. Despite her condition, she attends school, loves to sing and enjoys spending time with her grandparents. With our support, she began physical therapy at the Children's Rehabilitation Center (CRIT) in La Paz.

Over the last 8 years, Itzayana's treatment has progressed well, and she is now receiving physical therapy routinely at Padrino, which allows her to stay closer to home. It was this need for local access that inspired us to expand our rehabilitation services to minimize travel burdens for families like hers.

ALEJANDRA – A GIFT FOR PERSEVERANCE

Alejandra joined Padrino's Children with Special Needs (CSN) program in 2017, participating in therapies and vocational workshops. In 2021, a dermatological consultation revealed a metabolic disorder requiring long-term pediatric endocrinology care.

Through her dedication to treatment and creative expression in art classes, Alejandra made remarkable physical and emotional progress. In recognition of her efforts, our clinical team gifted her a beautiful, donated bicycle.

Alejandra later joined Padrino Power, a program for integrating physical activity into treatment for adolescents with metabolic conditions. Now almost 18, Alejandra will soon graduate from Padrino stronger and more confident than ever.

SAMUEL – A JOURNEY OF HEALING

At age two, Samuel came to Padrino with a rare arteriovenous malformation in his face, requiring specialized care once a month in Mexico City. His family could not sustain this journey over the long term and turned to Padrino for help.

Over the past seven years, Samuel has received comprehensive care including pediatric consultations, medical treatments, psychotherapy, family counseling, and air transportation when needed. He is now preparing for a complex, multidisciplinary surgery, which we hope will significantly improve the quality of his life.

GROWING STRONG WITH PADRINO



CINTHIA – HER FIRST TRIP TO THE SEA

Cinthia joined Padrino's Children with Special Needs (CSN) program in 2017 due to learning difficulties. She began therapy with vocational workshops to build skills, confidence, and community, and later received care from our visiting Pediatric Neurologist.

During group workshops, Cinthia's friends learned that she had never been to the sea. In a heartwarming group effort, Cinthia and two fellow students, Emily and Mariana, raised funds by selling bracelets and mask holders, and soon, they embarked on their adventure to the Sea of Cortez.

Today, Cinthia continues to grow through her embroidery work and ongoing treatment with Padrino. Her journey towards independence is well under way.

FÁTIMA – A LIFE TRANSFORMED

Fátima came to Padrino in October 2018 with Epilepsy, experiencing uncontrolled seizures that disrupted her daily life. After extensive testing, our neuro-pediatrics team developed a treatment plan requiring four medications and consistent therapy.

This kind of neurological treatment can be financially out of reach for many families. However, with our support and the generosity of our donors, Fatima received everything she needed.

Today, thanks to the rigorous follow-up by our clinical team and the hard work of her mother, Fatima's condition is stable with just one medication and soon, she may no longer need pharmacological treatment at all.

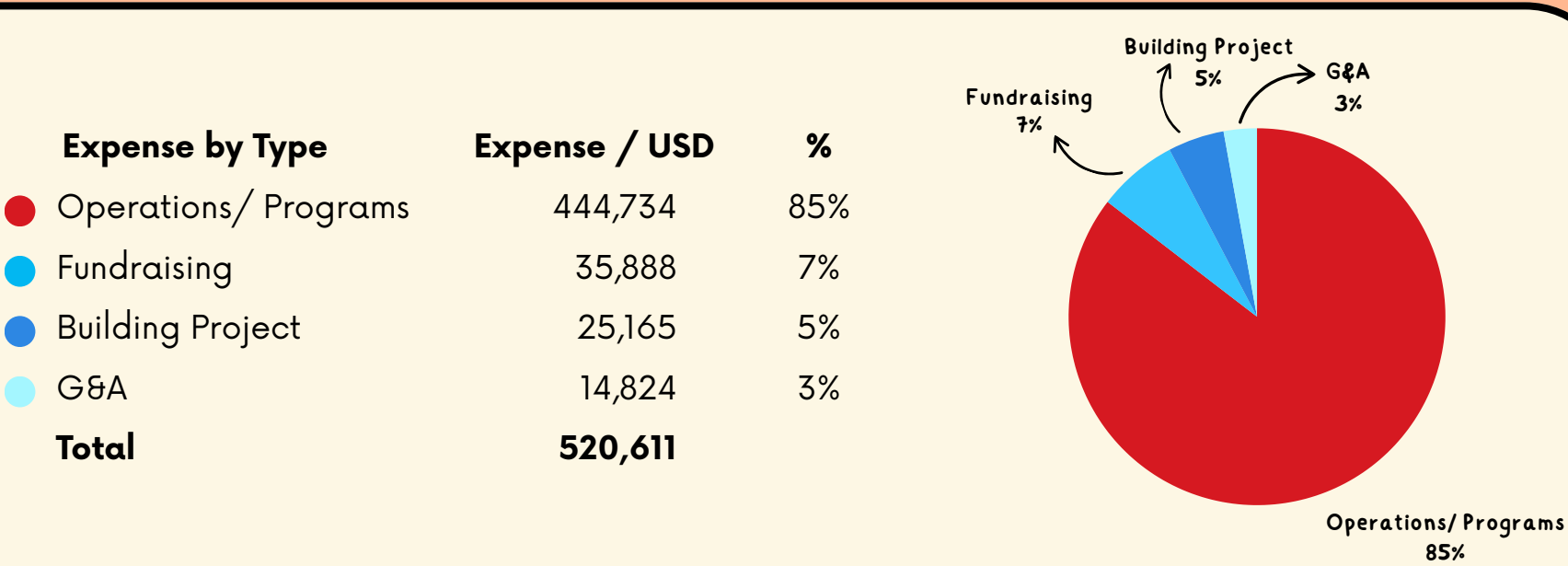
2024 FINANCIAL SUMMARY



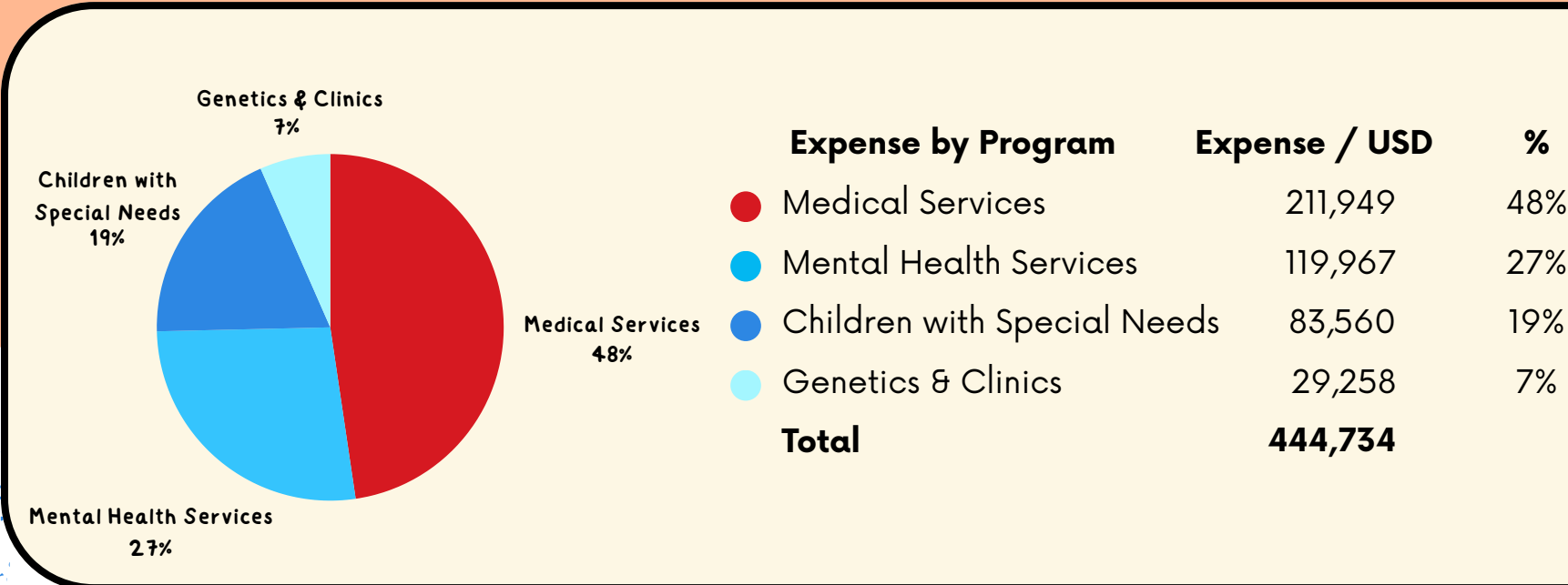
2024 Revenue by Source (USD)

ROOM TO GROW STRONG



INVESTING IN ACCESS TO CARE. ADVANCING HEALTH EQUITY.



As our population grows and patient needs increase, our current rented facilities are no longer adequate to meet the demand. After receiving a generous land donation in 2021, we are now planning for a purposefully built pediatric medical center designed to grow with our mission.

The two-story, fully accessible facility will provide space for pediatric consultations and specialty services; social work and mental health care; rehabilitation and physical therapy services; family counseling; telemedicine and diagnostic tools; a pharmacy; a guest suite for visiting providers; and staff areas, conference rooms, and storage.

The new facility will allow Padrino to:

- Eliminate the time families spend traveling to providers
- Eliminate waiting lists for new patients
- Expand newborn screening and specialty clinics
- Enhance diagnostic and therapeutic capabilities
- Provide onsite and secure pharmacy services
- Improve staff well-being and teamwork
- Provide consistent, high-quality care to more children

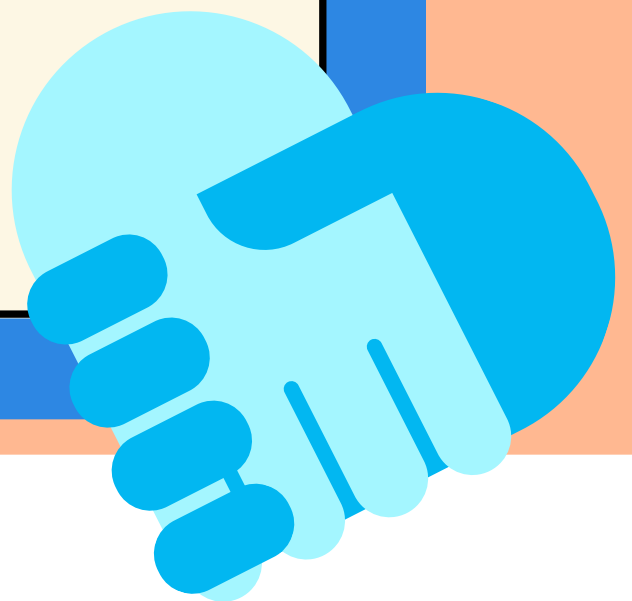
