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## LETTER FROM THE CHAIR

It was an evolutionary year for the Padrino Children's Foundation. We provided 5,922 intervention services to 512 patients, with world-class, complex, multidisciplinary care. We saw powerful transformations, such as a blind toddler embracing a new world with her inseparable cane and a boy with partial hearing loss gaining confident communication. We strengthened our focus on family involvement to help overcome diverse barriers to care and treatment, giving children a healthy beginning.

### **Padrino growing strong**

We welcomed two accomplished new board members, Milt Stewart and Santiago Mazoy, who bring valuable experience in law and non-profit leadership.

As the demand for complex and comprehensive care grows, we've evolved our services to meet all pediatric needs, introducing newborn screening and a program for adolescents with metabolic disorders. We offer educational workshops to support patients and families, and promote health and wellness knowledge through channels where we can be heard.

Our collaborative and highly individualized model is being shared as an example reaching underserved children across Mexico. Our operation is focused, efficient and driven by a team that each day acts with integrity and heart.

### **A mission enriched by our community**

We ended 2025 with confirmation to break ground on the new Padrino Pediatric Center, which took place in January 2026. It is an achievement made possible by our successful fundraising campaign and the generosity and trust of our community and donors.

The new center will expand access to early detection, coordinated treatment, specialist consultations, telemedicine, and family support, ensuring continuous integrated care for children and families close to home for decades to come. The construction project is supported by \$1.2 million USD raised to date, resources that have been stewarded responsibly with an additional +\$150,000 needed for completion and furnishing.

### **A most powerful way to give back is to give a child their health**

There are few opportunities where the impact of your gift is immediate, personal, and lasting. Many local families must choose between basic needs and essential healthcare; our mission is to change that.

## OUR IMPACT

In 2025, Padrino provided **5,922 interventions** for **512 patients**, including 148 new patients and 36% of these new patients were from El Pescadero. We have treated nearly 2000 children since our founding in 2016, with **an average of 150-190 local children receiving care each month, reflecting a 37% increase from 2024.**

Over nine years, Padrino has established a dedicated clinical team offering a wide range of pediatric care including medical, physical therapy, therapies for children with special

needs, mental and social health services, and an increasing focus on genetics. We offer health care clinics, education and awareness workshops, and recently launched a newborn screening program.

Facing a rapidly growing population and increasing cases of serious/rare diseases, we evolved our integrative health care model to specialize in comprehensive, multidisciplinary treatments and support for patients and families on complex medical and emotional journeys.

Thanks to continued support from donors and U.S., Canadian, and Mexican organizations, our new pediatric health center will allow us to scale services, ensuring healthcare access and a more promising future to children and families for decades to come.

## A NETWORK OF TRUSTED PARTNERS

To deliver comprehensive, multidisciplinary care for our patients, our clinical staff collaborates closely with a growing network of medical specialists across Mexico. Whenever possible, we minimize the need for families to travel to receive care; but when external referrals are needed, we ensure every patient is connected to high-quality partners.

We maintain strong partnerships with pediatric specialists, diagnostic services, hospitals, pharmacies, and other allied organizations, such as the Los Cabos Children's Foundation and iHope Genetic Alliance Program.

We are deeply grateful for these partnerships and for the shared commitment to achieving the best possible outcomes for every child we serve.



## OUR IMPACT ZONE



Based on the 2020 census, Padrino estimates we serve over 30% of children (birth to 18 years) in Todos Santos, El Pescadero, and surrounding communities who qualify due to financial need and limited access to pediatric healthcare. Growing partnerships, and our genetics clinic and newborn clinic, are expanding our reach across Baja California Sur, providing essential, specialized care to more children.



### Financial Aid for Medical Services (FAMS)

FAMS remains our highest-volume program, delivering 2,914 new interventions in 2025—an increase of 270 from the prior year. It provides pediatric medical care, laboratory testing, medications, and specialist visits, continually evolving with new collaborative specialists and treatments.

A key success was the collaboration with otolaryngologists Dra. Carolina Tella and Dr. Juan Hernaiz from Mexico City. They performed pro bono surgeries on nine of our patients who had been waiting for more than a year, including tonsillectomies, adenotonsillectomies, and the placement of ventilation tubes. Our clinical team expedited the surgeries and prepared follow-up services for holistic treatment and long-term care.

### Children with Special Needs (CSN)

The CSN program, which provides neurodevelopmental, physical, and vocational therapy to children with diverse needs, delivered 573 interventions in 2025—an increase of 193 from the previous year. We expanded patient care with new intervention strategies, such as sensory integration training and creating illustrated stories to support patient transitions and use of aids.

In partnership with our MSH team, we held a ‘Goodbye to Diapers’ workshop for parents, and we supported school inclusion initiatives. We also launched Padrino Power, a new program serving over 50 adolescents with metabolic disorders, offering a safe space for routine preventative and therapeutic physical activity, empowering them to build active, healthy lifestyles.

### Mental & Social Health (MSH)

Our MSH program is our second highest volume program delivering 2,023 therapeutic interventions in 2025—an increase of 879 from the prior year, highlighting the growing need for mental health, behavioral disorders, and emotional health treatment in our communities. To reduce wait times and provide timely care for our patients, we began collaborative partnerships with two child psychiatrists for in-office or telemedicine therapy. We improved therapeutic assessment by training in neurodevelopment evaluation.



## Rare Genetic Diseases

Padrino, in partnership with the iHope Genetic Alliance program, has conducted 12 rare genetic disease clinics (including 3 in 2025) leading to 343 consultations for families from across Baja California Sur. We delivered 51 advanced genetic study results early in the year, along with specialized counseling from our medical genetics team members: Dra. Valeria Hernandez, Dr. Rodrigo Moreno, and Dr. Raul Hernandez. This collaboration provided definitive answers and life-changing clinical direction for families.

Through this program, we have performed over 200 genetic tests for patients referred from doctors across our state, achieving a 60% success rate in diagnoses. We continue to raise awareness about genetic testing's importance, particularly for children with undiagnosed, potentially genetic health conditions, as diagnosis is crucial for starting treatment. Our aim is to empower families to seek answers, understand options, secure timely diagnoses, and access necessary treatment.

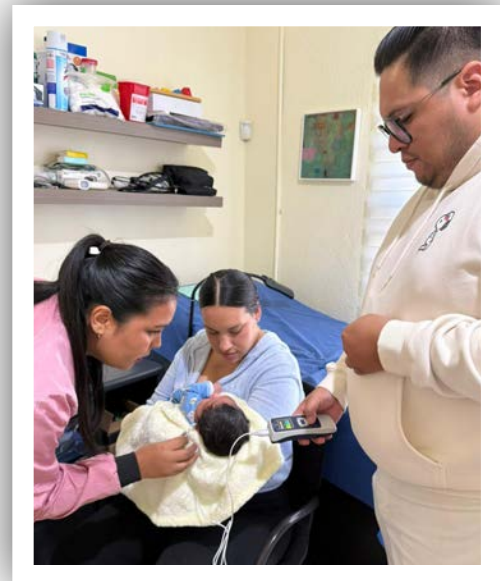


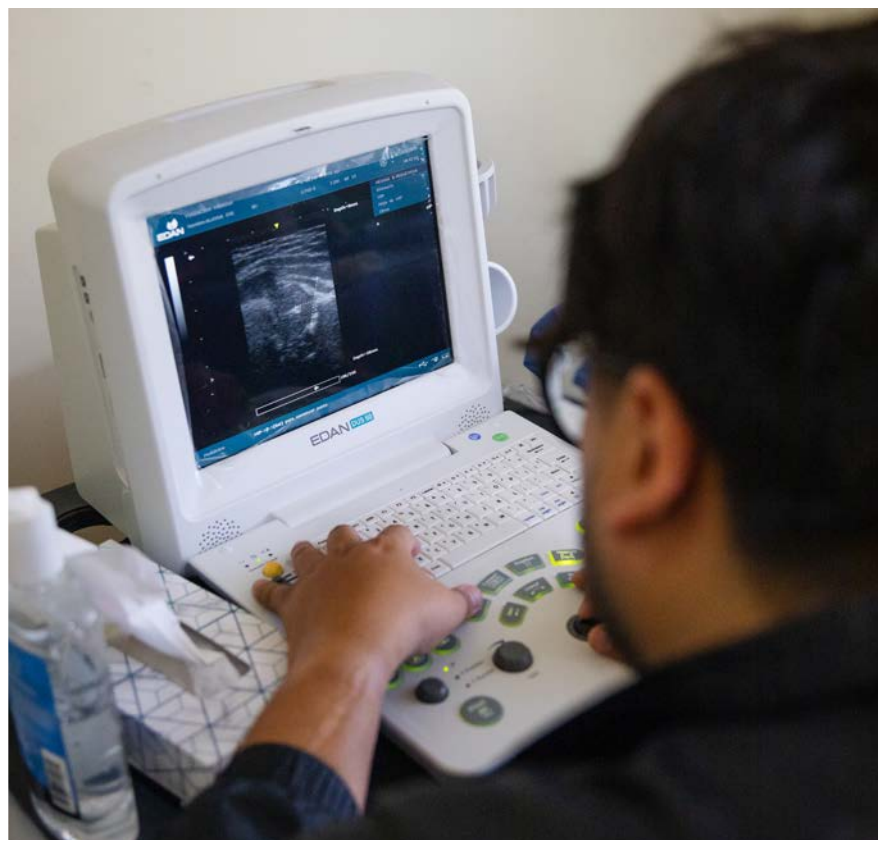
## Health Clinics

In 2025, we continued health and education clinics, leading to five pediatric interventions. We launched a monthly newborn screening service to detect and prevent curable diseases early, starting with hearing screenings. This service will expand in 2026 to include vision and hip dysplasia screenings. We also introduced family support workshops to foster harmony at home by educating parents on child development stages and providing a space for open dialogue and conflict resolution.

## Victor

### *Overcoming fear, becoming independent*

Five-year-old Victor arrived at Padrino with diagnoses of ASD, Sensory Processing Disorder, ADHD, and Joint Hypermobility, yet was full of energy and eager to learn.

Our clinical team created an individualized treatment plan focusing on improving his ability to follow direction and participate in daily and social activities. Services included pediatric consultations, child psychiatry, neurology, and weekly physiotherapy sessions using playful circuits to improve coordination, balance, and muscle strength for independence and social adaptation.

In just four months, Victor demonstrated greater autonomy and motor coordination, including overcoming his fear of water. His achievements resulted from the commitment of his parents and our multidisciplinary, collaborative clinical care.



## Rebeca

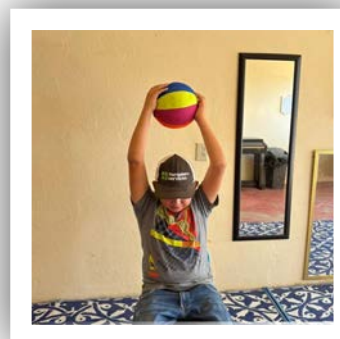
### *Boosting athletic performance*

Twelve-year-old basketball player Rebeca has been a Padrino patient since 2022, diagnosed with generalized anxiety disorder and ADHD. Her individualized, multidisciplinary treatment, including psychological care and physical exercise, provided structure and improved her physical and emotional stability. This comprehensive approach, supported by her family, led to a transformation, boosting Rebeca's motivation, self-confidence, and athletic performance. Her positive outcome highlights the importance of integrating physical activity with therapeutic processes.

## Andrés

### *Back in action*

Ten-year-old Andrés arrived at Padrino with an improperly healed fracture in his left lateral humeral condyle, limiting routine activities. Weekly, individualized physiotherapy sessions increased his range of motion, muscle strength, and coordination. Andrés is now reintegrated into daily life with minimal pain and has graduated from physiotherapy, continuing rehabilitation to achieve full independence.







## Valeria

### Working towards crucial first steps

Ten-month-old Valeria came to Padrino diagnosed with Down Syndrome and plagiocephaly and she has been receiving comprehensive, multidisciplinary care including Pediatrics, Endocrinology, and Physical Therapy. Early stimulation is vital for children with Down Syndrome to address muscle hypotonia and ligamentous hypermobility, which can affect motor skill development.

Thanks to her perseverance and her mother's support, Valeria has made excellent progress. She now has head and trunk control, can sit independently, and make turns—crucial steps toward future skills like eating, crawling, and walking. With love, courage and determination, Valeria and her mother are achieving their goals and building a future full of possibilities.

## REALITIES TRANSFORMED THROUGH THE POWER OF STORYTELLING

At Padrino, children are at the heart of everything we do. We believe that with the right support, resources, and empowering space, together we can transform their lives. We address both clinical needs and emotional well-being, and every tool aids in overcoming their challenges.

In 2025, our Children with Special Needs (CSN) program coordinator Leslie Castro began using storytelling to enhance therapy, improve treatment adherence, and foster a sense of belonging, moving beyond purely clinical methods.

### Luka and the Magic Headband

Luka, a young patient with Microtia (a congenital condition affecting ear development), refused to wear the prescribed hearing aid secured by a headband. Leslie created a personalized story for Luka, transforming the headband into a 'magic object' that opened doors to new adventures. Consequently, Luka now approaches his hearing aid with curiosity and confidence, a vital step for his development, communication, and social interaction.



### Aislin's Baton

Five-year-old Aislin was visually impaired from birth due to Septo-Optic Dysplasia. She struggled with mobility, sensory processing, language development, and behavioral issues, hindering her preschool participation.

Aislin began therapy, initially focused on cane use for walking, then expanding to address all associated disabilities. To foster understanding and empathy, Leslie created "Aislin's Baton," a story introducing Aislin and her cane—her inseparable companion for independence, alerting her to steps, walls, and clear paths. Although unable to see, Aislin explores her world using her cane, hands, mouth, voice, and heart.

Aislin has made significant progress and now attends primary school with independence and confidence. Sharing her story with classmates beforehand ensured she was welcomed with respect and inclusion.

These examples demonstrate the power of a story to transform a child's perception, allowing them to become the capable and valued protagonist of their own life.



## A FAMILY'S LOVE

### Transforming the health care journey

At Padrino, we believe family love, support and presence are essential for effective patient healthcare and adherence to treatment. We encourage active family involvement in decision-making and routine care, offering resources to promote a nurturing family environment.

### Recognizing the love and perseverance of our patient families

Given the rise in complex, long-term healthcare needs, families often face journeys requiring commitment and patience amidst existing hardships. Our clinical team is uniquely positioned to offer guidance and encouragement, particularly when navigating multiple services. In May 2025, we launched a workshop to equip parents with communication tools by teaching them to recognize and understand stages of child development.

For our patients, positive parental attention fosters healthy routines (sleep, eating) and emotional stability at home, reducing anxiety, depression, and adversity to illness.



### Fearless, determined, empowered...

We are inspired daily by the dedication of the mothers and fathers who are unwavering in support for their children's good health, accompanying them through consultations, treatments, and therapies with love, patience, and determination. They showed commitment to fostering harmony, making changes, and actively engaging in therapeutic processes. Young parents grew with Padrino, gaining new confidence and independence.

We also recognize grandparents who support the family, often assisting with care. A dedicated grandmother with 18 grandchildren accompanied one granddaughter to all her appointments, being present and actively supporting her progress.

### Together with Padrino, making a profound difference

Working together, we profoundly improve physical, mental, and emotional outcomes, enhance treatment adherence, and promote resilience. It is beautiful to see our patients achieve their healthcare goals and thrive in a hopeful, healthy future.

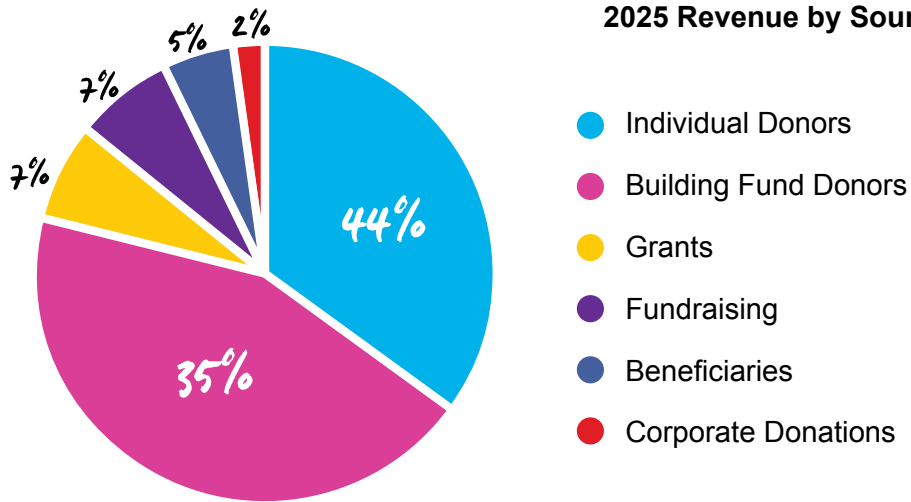

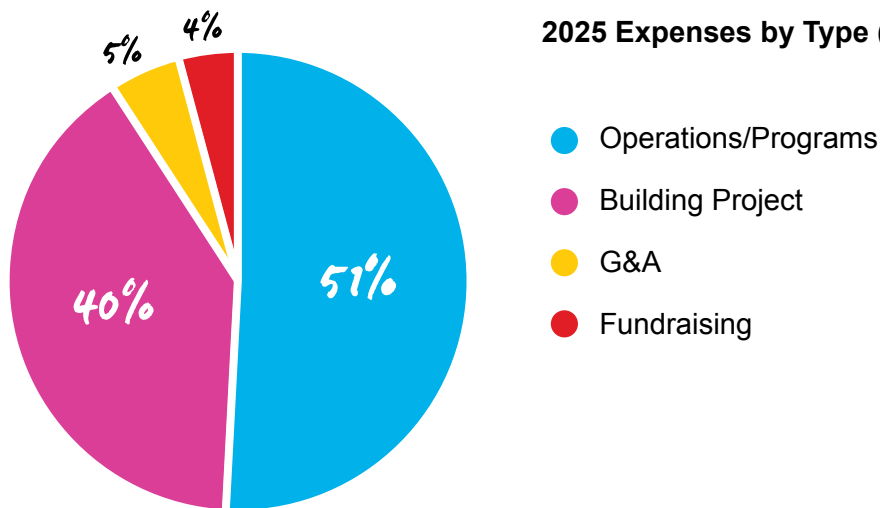

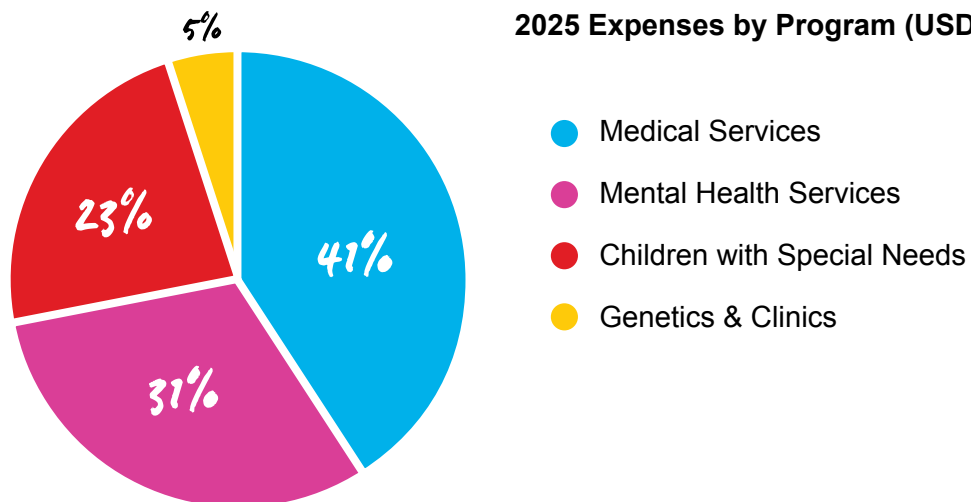
2025 Revenue by Source
